

To wear or not wear a Helmet on the slopes?

Following Michael Schumacher's recent devastating accident the debate has been reignited on whether to wear or not wear a helmet on the

With about 60% of skiers in some European resorts and almost 90% of snowboarders now wearing helmets, there is still a large group of people who don't wear a helmet. So, let's look at the main issues that affect

Does a helmet really improve my safety upon impact?

The answer is, it depends upon the speed of impact. Helmets are designed to protect and absorb impact at speed of up to around 25 km/h - 15mph.

At much higher speeds, snowsport helmets cannot practically be the thickness and weight required to absorb the impact completely

However at more controlled speeds a recent study from brain injury charity Headway found:

Forces exerted on the skull were "four times less" when head protection was worn. A helmet's liner absorbs a proportion of the impact; the acceleration of the head is reduced; and the impact on the skull is spread over a larger area.

So, realistically we have to look at helmet wearing as part of an overall safety approach. A helmet will help protect you from more serious head injuries on impact whilst maintaining sensible speeds on the slopes, which will also help protect those around you from all sorts of injuries. A helmet on its own will not improve slope safety, it can help make you safer but being a responsible slope user goes a lot further in making everyone safer.

"Quite often impact at very high speeds is the result of skiing or boarding out of control.'

So – this leads on to our next question.

Does wearing a helmet make people ski or board faster?

One of the arguments against wearing helmets is that people ski or board faster because they feel more protected, and as a result become more of a danger to their fellow slope users and themselves.

People need to know that a helmet doesn't make you invincible and they shouldn't be skiing or boarding at speeds or in a way that they wouldn't do without a helmet.

Are helmets heavy and uncomfortable to wear?

One main reason why skiers in particular resist wearing a helmet is that they are just not used to it. They think it will be very heavy, sweaty, uncomfortable and not look stylish enough.

Helmets are now more stylish than ever before and a lot lighter than you'd imagine - most weighing around the 500g mark. They are warm, and if you choose a model with adjustable ventilation, you can open the vents when you need to make it more breathable. No need for a sweaty head! See the Scott - Roam helmet with adjustable ventilation (pictured

When choosing a helmet, go to the store and try on different makes,



because most often you will find one make matches your head shape better than another. This you cannot see from an image in an on-line shop!

So do I convert to a helmet?

Michael had been wearing a helmet which broke on impact whilst skiing inbetween pistes at Meribel. However doctors have said that if he had not been wearing a helmet he would most probably have died then and there on the piste.

It's personal choice. More people than ever are wearing helmets out there and there's no escaping that.

So after around 25 years of skiing I finally converted to helmet wearing. Mainly because having been taken out by an "out of control" skier in the past, I now feel that I would be vulnerable to head impact from a collision with a skier or boarder who is wearing a helmet when I'm not.

You can be a very capable skier, control your speed and slope awareness, but you cannot control that of those using the slope around you! I feel safer buckled up!

with rainwater, was the first lady to win this award. But best remembered is the year when the Essex Chronicle famously reported that Bill Palmer had won a prize for "Best wind in show"!

Over the years, enthusiasm for making wine diminished and members began bringing more and more commercial wines to meetings for tasting and comparison. Hence the Wine Circle now considers itself to be a wine appreciation society rather than a wine making society. This does not impede a small number of stalwarts who still make wine from whatever fruit comes their way.

The Wine Circle meets on the first Tuesday of each month when a variety of events are organised. These range from commercial wine tastings, quizzes and speakers on a range of subjects, with four or five dates each year including an evening meal.

Annual membership is £15 per person, which is 6 shillings more than the Wine Circle spent on wine and food in its 5th anniversary year. How times change!

Danbury Wine Circle is very well supported with monthly meetings usually being attended by more than 70% of members - and this includes the AGM!

In this anniversary year there will be a special celebration event on June 3rd which we hope all members will be able to attend.

While many of us were having fun during the Christmas holiday, a team of trained Volunteers were on standby to go into action if there was a medical emergency. They are our Community First Responder Team. They support the Ambulance Service, aiming to get to an emergency perhaps even sooner than an ambulance as they are based locally, and they provide assistance until the ambulance arrives.

This Christmas, the Volunteers worked out a rota that meant they had the whole of Christmas week covered except for a short gap of 2 hours on Christmas Day itself. That's the whole of every 24 hours! And they were certainly needed this year.

They were called out on the Monday – twice - and on one of those times got to the patient before the ambulance even though they had to go a long way round to avoid a fallen tree. Those 2 calls were to addresses in Danbury.

On Christmas Day itself, the first call came at 4.40 in the morning – yes, 4.40am! That was to a patient in South Woodham Ferrers. More was to come with a call to East Hanningfield at 6.45pm; and a third call, this time to Sandon, was needed at 9.05pm.

Boxing Day was quiet, but on the Friday there was another urgent call to a Danbury address, mid morning. Then 2 calls on Saturday 28th, one on Monday 30th, and to round up the busy festive period the Volunteer on duty overnight on New Year's Eve had 3 calls before breakfast time on New Year's Day all from Little Baddow, and another from South Woodham Ferrers around when he must have been having his breakfast!

Our grateful thanks must go to our First Responder Team for the support they give to our community. If you feel you might be able to spare a few hours from time to time to help, give Gordon Wren a call on 224309 to find out a bit more. There's no pressure to put in more time than you are ready to offer, no prior expertise is required and full training is given.

Antifreeze Poisoning

At this time of year when the weather is cold and the car is frozen we quickly reach for the antifreeze. But what lots of people do not realise is that it's extremely toxic to cats and dogs.



Ethylene glycol, the main constituent of antifreeze, is poisonous for cats and dogs. Pets are attracted to the sweet taste of ethylene glycol and many will lap up spilt or leaking antifreeze from garage floors and driveways.

Ethylene glycol is converted in the body to toxic products which cause irreversible kidney damage.

Signs of antifreeze poisoning can depend on the amount ingested. Common signs can include depression, incoordination (animal appears drunk) and vomiting. Sometimes there is excessive thirst and urination. These can be followed by muscle twitching and 12-24 hours after ingestion acute kidney failure. Seizures and death can quickly follow due to uraemia (failure of urine production).

If you see any of these signs or have a suspicion your pet has come into contact with antifreeze call your veterinary surgeon without delay.

Provided intensive care is started before too much damage has occurred to the kidneys some pets may recover but often the prognosis is poor.

Whether you are a pet owner or not, if you use antifreeze in the future please take care not to spill any. If you do, wash down the area thoroughly. Do not leave containers of antifreeze open or in an area pets can get to them.

Please be aware of this winter poison and help prevent pets suffering unnecessarily.



An agile home is a happy home

With January being the most likely month for relationships to break up, one of the most common causes of a split is the feeling of resentment, with one person thinking they are doing the lion's share of the household tasks... Does this sound familiar to you?

Often, one person feels that they are doing everything and this can lead to resentment, bitterness and feelings of being taken for granted which as you can imagine, impacts on intimacy and the level of happiness within the family unit. When I have explored this issue by asking if there are any jobs that can be delegated, a frequent response is "I don't want to tell them what needs to be done, they should KNOW what needs to be done...after all, I do." A fair point perhaps but this approach would not be successful out of the home.

It is curious to consider quite how different relationships are at work than they are at home and this can often be put down to the strategies that we use. Consider for a moment the way in which a business project is run; typically with a visible project plan, named stakeholders, key objectives, delegated tasks, measurable timescales and a contingency plan.

Now consider how an average home is run; with key members of the household carrying out 'owned' tasks. Rarely (except in extremely well organised households!) are these tasks documented so that the other household members can see quite who is doing what.

Agile working practices are highly successful when translated into the household setting. Households can be transformed by implementing an agile working system - often as simple as designing a flow chart divided up into three columns: **STUFF TO DO, THINGS IN PROGRESS, THINGS DONE**.


Tasks are then written onto post it notes and posted onto the chart. The idea is that the tasks are then discussed and most importantly visible! This coupled with the addition of a weekly 20 minute meeting ensures that concerns are heard and even in hectic households the results are excellent with more tasks being shared and vitally, the lines of communication open.

It could be said that the most important business that we have IS the family?

When you identify and remove the barriers of what is making you unhappy, you are consciously choosing to be happier.



CAODS SPELL-BINDING 'THE WITCHES OF EASTWICK'



LITTLE BADDOW PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on 9th January 2014. County Councillor John Spence had been helpful with our highways problems, although most were still on-going eg as yet no installation of visible depth markers on regularly flooded roads nor improved parking at Paper Mill Lock. The Highways Department's response to gritting the potentially treacherous stretch of road north of Spring Close, used four times a day by a school bus, was deemed totally inadequate so once again Mr Spence would be asked to intervene to get action.

Police Sergeant Morley, responsible for our area, failed to attend for the second time, being deployed elsewhere. Council wants to talk to him about its position in relation to complaints of activities at the area of Hurrells Ford, although none from Essex Wild Life Trust. It was cited that there has also been significant harassment of some visitors by others at the Ford. A letter will be written to the local Police Inspector requesting guaranteed attendance by Sergeant Morley at the next meeting of a Parish Council which is in his area.

Three substantial thefts from garden sheds were reported and advice given to lock properly, check and be vigilant. Additionally Council was concerned that a dog owner had found a snare in a badger sett in Holybread Wood. It was noted that this is a reportable offence and there will be increased vigilance to ensure protection.

In the development agenda item, where there were reapplications without change then there were still objections. but a re-application for a replacement house on Postmans Lane had been significantly altered and there was now no further objection. It was noted that before a proposed large grain store with hard standing (to which Council did not object) could be built at Hammonds Farm, there would first be an officially organised archaeological survey.

The crack in the flooring of the Pavilion was to be repaired and monitored. Council has protested about imposed bank charges and is worried about the new VAT proposals. All Hall storage users must follow the guidelines. Council will pay the Film Club storage needs.

Is Your Neighbourhood Switched On?

Please carry out a weekly task of setting your automatic light timers to come on earlier - It is now starting to get dark at around 16:00

As the autumn nights draw in it's time to think about the burglar out there and not leaving them "tell tale" signs that your home is empty and vulnerable. The art of illusion is to try and make it look as though your home is occupied even though you are not there. Provide that first impression to the "would be" burglar that this house is occupied, it looks too difficult to get into and that if they do try there is a good chance they will get their collar felt!

Lighting, if your house is overlooked and there is the chance of burglars being seen they will prefer to go elsewhere, so get some decent lighting on your house. Dusk till dawn activated lighting on the front and rear with energy saving bulbs, not only deters the burglar but you can see who is at your door or around your home, and also when you return home you have a welcoming light.

· Is there clear unobstructed access to the rear? Burglars will prefer to gain access out of sight at the rear. Where possible fence and gate access to rear gardens, top this with some trellis or spiky toppings (the spiky topping requires a warning notice). How about some defensive planting, what's this you ask.....something like Berberus, Pyracantha or Hawthorn around perimeter fencing or anything else you wish to protect i.e. domestic fuel tank (some garden centres sell more established plants).

The illusion: - Try to make it look similar to when you are there - table lamps inside on timers (don't use energy saving bulbs with digital timers it shortens the life of the bulb) or use a "dusk till dawn" sensor (bulbs are now available with a built in sensor), a radio on a talking programme, it all helps. You can even buy a device now called "Fake TV" that mimics the light from a television. Out and about? For a little extra confidence consider carrying a personal attack alarm, many come with a torch and are quite cheap from DIY stores, internet etc. Most all be aware of your surroundings, avoid concentrating on mobile phones and music devices whilst out and about.

Steve Dodge of the Independent Financial Advice Centre writes Do Nothing and lose £137,500

April the 5th is the end of the tax year and once again we find that a decision must be made regarding pension funds as yet more rule changes come into effect. Doing nothing could easily cost you a fortune.

Currently we are all allowed a maximum pension fund of £1,500,000. It used to be unlimited, then £1.8M now £1.5M and on April 6th it reduces to £1.25M.

Now I can hear the cry "for goodness sake, how many people will this affect"? Well 360,000 of us apparently and the largest proportion of these are here in the South East.

The point is that it is possible to keep the £1.5million pound allowance if you sign a form to protect it, called "Fixed Protection". The downside of this is that you can no longer make any pension contributions, and you must not have applied for any previous form of protection "Enhanced" "Primary" or "Fixed 2012".

If your fund is over £1.25 million on the 5th April you can also apply for "Individual Protection" so if your fund is say £1.4million you can apply to have that limit instead of £1.25M. The daft thing is if you apply for individual protection you can carry on making pension contributions! But why limit your fund to £1.4M when it could be £1.5M. It is possible therefore that the right thing to do is apply for both forms of protection!

Please don't make the mistake of thinking your fund is presently well below the limits, you need to think what it could be in future. An £800,000 fund at 7% growth only takes 6.5 years to reach 1.25M! Even a £400,000 fund could grow to £1.25M in only 17 years without adding any contributions.

If your fund exceeds the limits, when you draw the benefits the surplus is returned to you as a lump sum, LESS 55% Tax!! Getting it right is therefore rather important. Signing a form before April 5th could mean an extra £250,000 in your pension "pot". Do nothing and you could pay £137,500 extra tax instead!

April 5th is also the deadline for this year's ISA (Individual Savings Account) allowance. It is possible to invest up to £11,520 per individual in an Equity (Share based) ISA account and pay no higher rate tax (up to 45%), capital gains tax (up to 28%), or have to declare anything to the Inland Revenue.

There was a rumour that the Government would like to stop these accounts, or limit the amount you can invest as they are losing a lot of revenue, so make sure you use the allowance, while it exists.

So should you make perhaps a final pension contribution before April 5th, apply for fixed protection 2014, individual protection, or invest in ISA's both before and after the deadline?

As usual your IFA should have the answers for you but please don't leave seeing them until the last minute, this is a complex situation requiring careful thought not a rushed last minute

A treasured historic asset the Chelmer & Blackwater Navigation



Today the Chelmer and Blackwater Navigation provides an attractive 14-mile recreation corridor serving ramblers, natural history enthusiasts, fishermen, and boat users - as well as those who might just want to relax with a nice cup of tea and watch the world go by at places like Paper Mill Lock. The navigation incorporates 13 locks, has a towpath throughout its length and runs from Springfield Lock in Chelmsford to the sea lock at Heybridge Basin near Maldon. It was opened in 1797 and at its peak it was carrying 60,000 tons of goods traffic each year. When commercial goods traffic ceased in 1972 leisure pursuits were encouraged but all was not plain sailing: soon many locks were broken or in a bad state of repair and, after surviving for more than 200 years, the original Navigation Company collapsed in 2003. Now all locks are in full working order and the navigation is managed by Essex Waterways Ltd.- a company formed as a subsidiary of the Inland Waterways Association.

The South Woodham Ferrers Local History Society is delighted that Essex Waterway's hard-working chairman Roy Chandler has agreed to give a presentation at the Society's next meeting. His talk 'The Chelmer & Blackwater Navigation: Its Recent History' will concentrate on what Essex Waterways has been able to achieve in the last 20 years or so. The evening should give a valuable insight into the practical outworking of a project with a significant local history interest and will provide an interesting new perspective for any ramblers, natural history enthusiasts, fishermen, boat users - and tea drinkers - who may already enjoy what this treasured local asset has to offer...

The talk will take place at 8pm on **Wednesday 5th February** at Champions Manor Hall Community Centre, Hullbridge Road, South Woodham Ferrers CM3 5LJ. 
