EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Peter says:" Since joining CAODS in 2007 I have performed in s fantastic shows and have served on committee for the past s years. Having served in that time as the Society Treasurer my present role is to support and advise the current Treasurer, Jean Pinkney. Drawing on the experience of my day job managing a diverse multi-million pound budget in the lesiure industry I advice the Treasurer on accounting, tax and financial matters as required. I also provide a business perspective along with a non-acting members view in my contribution to committee discussions and the decision making processes."

Jess says:" I was elected to the committee in December so as a newbie I'm still learning the ropes! Our new website looks fantastic (thank you everyone involved for all their hardwork) but it's still a work in progress with lots of things to update on a regular basis. As the first port of call for many new members we feel it looks great and gives plenty of information about our society and what we do. My main committee "job" is to update the website weekly or, in the run up to show week, daily! With recent news, publicity details, information for members, events, social occasions, show details, reviews, photos and all the little bits and pieces that need to be on there it keeps me busy. The website really does have a lot on it so it's worth checking in and having a look around. As well as the day-to-day running of the website are long term projects are working on updating our mailing list and also getting all our show information and photos from the archive onto the website, with shows going back to 1920 it's quite a task! If anyone has any ideas for the website then please contact me using the online form on the website or my email address is in the members area under committee."

Dave says:" I am on the publicity team carrying out various tasks. I also manage the 100 Club and am second signature for payment approvals."

Jean says:" I think most of you will know me as I have been around for a while, but do you realise as Treasurer what the job entails!

I am responsible for maintaining the records for the society of every penny and pound that we spend and the income to the society. Computerisation has made this much easier, but it is still a time consuming job. I issue cheques and complete on line transfers and reconcile monthly bank statements.

I set budgets for each show, based on past experience, then monitor them and feedback actual costs to the executive committee during the months run up to the shows. The results are finalised after the show is finished and analysed. It is important when choosing a show, that the committee are mindful of the potential costs. I also liaise with the Stage Manager to ensure all requirements are met.

At the end of the financial year, I prepare our year end accounts ready to go to be audited. Balancing to the last penny can prove tricky, but a challenge in itself. These are presented to the members of the society at our AGM and questions can be asked to ensure everyone understands them.

Other parts of the job are renewing insurances, updating our figures on the charity commission website and researching any new products around or new ways of doing things. I also apply for licences, talk to rights holders and liaise with the Civic Box office on sales. To sum it up I am accountable to all members of caods.

So quite a mixture to keep me busy!
